Requirements and procedure for becoming a Supervisor of the Psychodrama Association for Europe.

There are three levels of supervisors in the Association. Those are:

- 1. Full Supervisor
- 2. Nominated supervisor
- 3. Delegated supervisor

Neither the Chairman nor other board members can recommend a candidate to become a supervisor.

Requirements and procedure for the appointment as a Full Supervisor.

To become a Full Supervisor you need to:

- 1. Send in the application
- 2. Have trained two 1st level groups and one 2nd level group.
- 3. Get supervision on the leading of your 1st level group. Amount of hours according to the supervisor.
- 4. Get supervision on the leading of your first 2nd level group. Amount of hours according to the supervisor.
- 5. Send in the confirmation letter to the Working Group of the Supervision Committee from your supervisor.

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- 6. Send in a recomendation to the Working Group of the Supervision Committee from the board of the institute you've led the 1st and 2nd level groups
- 7. Have done an open presentation during the Supervison Committee about your work as psychodrama supervisor with trainees or how you imagine doing it.
- 8. The attendant members of the Supervision Committee decide afterword the presentation about the appointment as *Full Supervisor*.

Requirements and procedure for the appointment as a Nominated Supervisor

The status of *Nominated Supervisor* can be needed in countries or institutes with non or a small number of Full or Nominated Supervisors, and where there are trainees who need supervision during their psychodrama training.

To become a Nominated Supervisor you need to:

- 1. Send in the application
- 2. Have trained two 1st level groups and one 2nd level group.
- 3. Get supervision on the leading of your 1st level group. Amount of hours according to the supervisor.
- 4. Get supervision on the leading of your first 2nd level group. Amount of hours according to the supervisor.
- 5. Send in the confirmation letter to the Working Group of the Supervision Committee from your supervisor.
- 6. Have had your supervision supervised by a Full Supervisor minimum 20 hours.
- 7. The period of the status as Nominated Supervisor is limited to 3 years. During this time the presentation has to be done to become a Full Supervisor.
- 8. The Working Group of the Supervision Committee decides about the appointment as *Nominated Supervisor*.

Requirements and procedure for the appointment as a Delegated Supervisor.

The status as *Delegated Supervisor* can be needed in countries or institutes with non or a small number of Full or Nominated Supervisors, and where there are trainees who need supervision during their psychodrama training.

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To become a Delegated Supervisor you need to:

- 1. Send in the application.
- 2. Have finished your own training including the certificate and got license as the trainer. Trained at least one 1st level group as a main trainer.
- 3. Send in two recommendation letters to the Working Group of the Supervision Committee. One from a Full supervisor and one can be from a member.
- 4. Get supervision on the leading of your 1st level group. Amount of hours according to the supervisor.
- 5. Send in the confirmation letter to the Working Group of the Supervision Committee from your supervisor.
- 6. The Working Group of the Supervision Committee decides about the appointment as *Delegated Supervisor*.

As a *Delegated Supervisor* you can do individual supervision (no group supervision). The permission applies exceptionally only for participants of a special group or for a special period of time.

As *Delegated Supervisor* you must receive constant supervision from a Full Supervisor. If there are several Delegated Supervisors, it makes sense to do the supervision in a group, because of learning from each other. The Supervisor and the group have regular appointments. The attendance is obliged for every *delegated supervisor*.

III. Institutional conditions

I. Personal prerequisites

- Personal system of values.
- Inner clarity about dependencies (personal, ideological and financial nature)
- Confrontational abilities, i.e. ability and readiness to take responsibility in/during confrontations.
- "Nothing human should be strange to him/her" but with good humor and self-parody.
- Resilience.
- Adequate sense of proximity and distance in the supervision process.
- Adequate working with Tele- and assignment processes.

II. Professional prerequisites

- Ten years professional experience, general competence in the field.
- Proof of further professional and post-graduate education after the Psychodrama degree studies.
- Proof of theoretical knowledge in the context of a public lecture or publication
- Practical demonstration of psychodramatic supervision in the Institutional sphere

III. Institutional conditions

- Full membership of the Psychodrama Association for Europe e.V.
- Loyalty to the Association, i.e. Supervisors from other institutes do not automatically qualify for appointment as Supervisors by Supervision Committee
- Proof of leadership from completed Psychodrama training groups; as a rule, two lower level and one higher level group, the last subject to the supervision duty.
- Honorary work on the committees of the Psychodrama Association for Europe e.V.
